Know the Regionals Rules:

General Rules:

- 🐕 Be kind
- 🐕 Pick up after your dog
- 🐕 No dog-dog, human-dog, or human-human aggression will be tolerated.
- 🐕 No treats allowed in the rings, except during warm-up runs.
- 🐕 Dogs must be leashed on Fairgrounds property except when they are in the ring competing.
- 🐕 Dogs must enter the ring on leash and exist on leash (leash buckets will be provided).

Regionals Scoring:

[AAC Regionals Rules and Guidelines](#), available on the AAC website, state that scoring is based on a combination of speed and accuracy across multiple runs. Competitors must complete

- 🐕 **Two Jumpers runs**
- 🐕 **Two Standard runs**
- 🐕 **Two Gamble Runs**

Each run is timed, and faults (such as knocking down a bar or missing a contact zone) result in penalties that either add to the dog's time or deduct from their score. Bonus points are awarded for clear rounds and successful gambles. The aggregate score from these six runs determines the winners, with the highest-scoring dogs in each category being declared the regional champions.



Nationals Qualification

To qualify for the AAC National Championships, a dog must earn a **minimum of 350 points across all six runs.**

- 🐕 Junior handlers and competitors using the Accessibility Option need **300 points to qualify.**

Important: Copies of Scribe Sheets will be available in a bin outside of each Ring. Competitors should check for errors, and if needed, speak to the judge right away, because only they can overturn what is written on the scribe sheets. Competitors can also check live scoring results at digitaldogsports.ca/results. If there are errors, report them to the Head Trial Scorer who will verify it with the physical Scribe Sheet (but not the Judge, as they will not likely remember your run at that point).

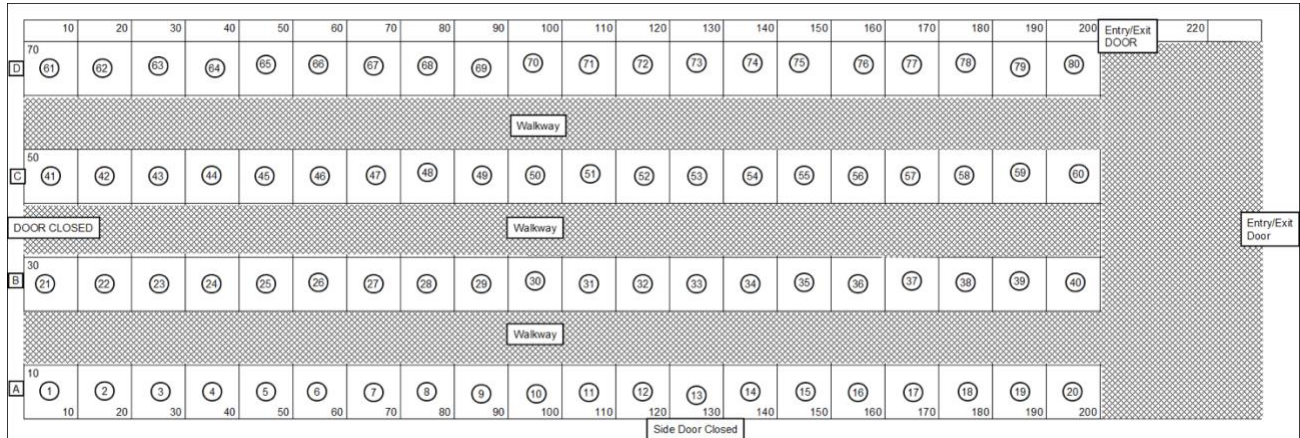

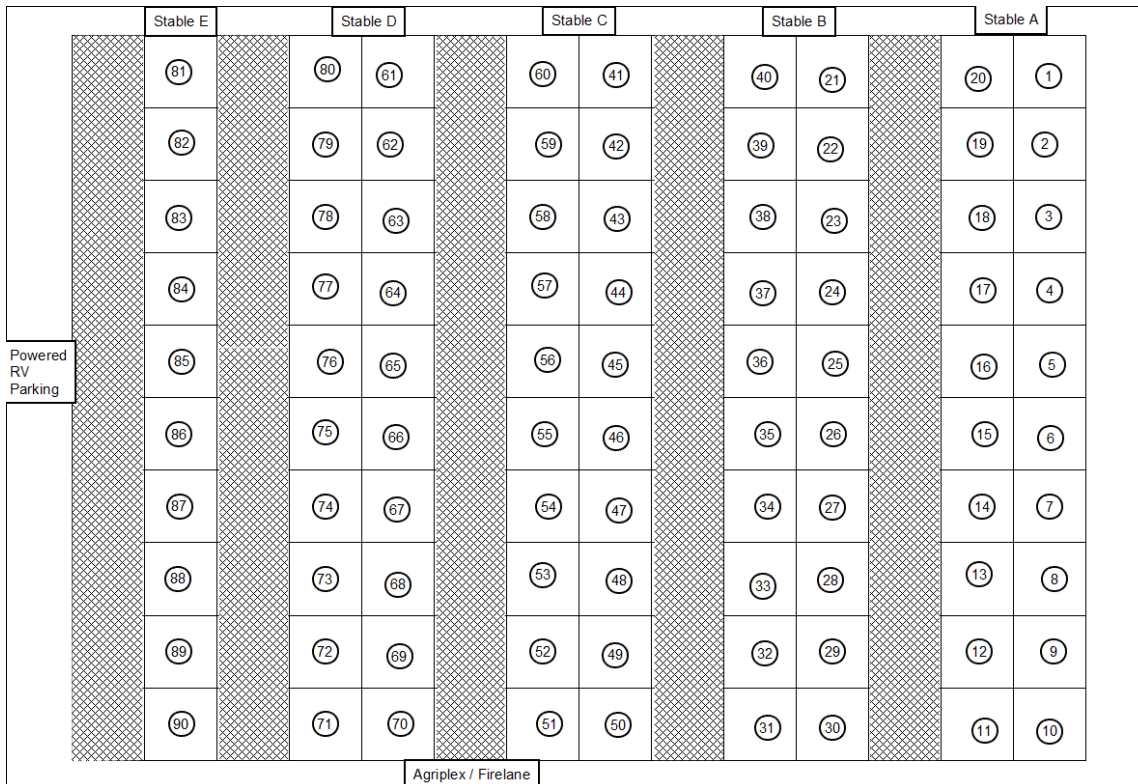

Rings 1 (Spec/vets) & 2 (Regular)

There are no jumps in the warm up rings, so no jump height gate list will be created. Check in with the Gate on duty, and join the queue to run. Ring 2 will have a standard height A-frame and Ring 1 the lower height. You can use your tickets in one ring or both, if you have purchased more than one round, but the A-frame will not change heights at any time. Both courses will be the same. You have 70 seconds to run the course or practice. Purchased tickets will be in your check-in bag.

It is your choice when to show up for your run, but please do not wait until the very end of the day—the rings will close at 4 pm (no refunds for unused tickets!)

You may purchase additional warm up tickets on Friday—see someone at the Check-in table in the RCMP Building. Warm up rounds are \$8.00.

Spec/vets height A-frame – Ring 1
Standard height A-frame – Ring 2

Please Note:

Food and toys will be allowed during the warm up runs on Friday only and under the following conditions:

- 🐾 Toys are in good state of repair
- 🐾 Toys do not contain audible noise makers
- 🐾 Training aids (e.g., clickers, target plates, etc.) are not allowed
- 🐾 Food may not be thrown on the ground or to the dog, and may only be fed from the hand or container – nothing crumbly!

Please be considerate and cautious if you use food in the warm up rings. It could be your dog looking for that dropped treat on Saturday!

Steeplechase Final (Non-AAC Sanctioned)

On Sunday, once all regionals events are complete, the 2026 Regionals Team and Capital Comets Dog Sports Club will host a Steeplechase Final (non-sanctioned), based on the results from the two steeplechase events on Friday. The Steeplechase Final will be designed and judged by Capital Comets' very own **Gerry Sloan!**

To qualify for the steeplechase final, you need to finish in the top 2 of your class in either of Friday's Steeplechase courses, whether you qualified for AAC purposes or not. If you finish in the top two in both of Friday's runs, you still only get one chance to run on Sunday, but you have reduced the number of competitors you will be running against by keeping another dog out of that spot. There are potentially four competition spots in each of the 19 jump/division heights. Each height and division will have its own cash jackpot based on the number of entries in the two Friday Steeplechase events. There will be no combining of heights or divisions. There is no fee to enter the Steeplechase Finals (but it is only open to those who are invited to run based on Friday's results). The Qualifiers' list for the Sunday event will be posted on Sunday morning in the results area, along with the jackpot amounts for each final.
